¹Adult Education Scholarship funds 3 hours graduate/undergraduate study, Road Scholar (non-ASTEF), Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at UT Austin, research, non-DKG conferences, or other lifelong learning activity.

²TSO Doctorate – must have completed 18 hours toward the doctorate by first summer term of year of application. Scholarship period is 1 year beginning with the summer term and ending with spring or May of the following year.

³Maetha Griffin Weatherby Scholarship requires attendance at one or more Texas State Conventions and requires member to match the amount awarded by Alpha State. Must be for educational travel. Applicant must be employed in the education profession at the time of application and remain employed in education during the academic year following the application. Scholarship can be received only 1 time.

⁴Mini Grants are for non-traditional professional development such as non-DKG conferences, workshops, research. The scholarship time period for the October application is November 1 – October 31 of the following year. The scholarship time period for the March application is July 1 – June 30 of the following year.

⁵Aspiring Educator Award application must have the signature of the current TSO chapter member sponsoring the applicant and a letter from that member. The second letter must be from the applicant's immediate supervisor or employer. Recipients can apply each year for no more than 4 years.

For TSO State Scholarship Letters of endorsement – When requiring three letters, they must be from the Chapter President, immediate supervisor, and one character reference. When requiring two – one must be from the Chapter President and one character reference. If the applicant is the Chapter President, they **MUST** have a letter from another officer.
